

Easter Then and Now

From time to time my sister unearths pictures from long ago and sends them to me. Most of them I remember. Some of them I'd just as soon not. Among those, there are a couple of Easter pictures that bring a chuckle. What passed for dressing up in those days is pretty comical. In one of those pictures I'm in a hat and a bow tie, and she's in a frilly dress and an Easter bonnet. Both of us have Easter baskets in our hands, ready to head out into the yard for the egg hunt. Our kids were horrified when we told them the eggs we hunted were real boiled eggs with dyed shells--and that we ate them when we found them! They would have been even more horrified if they'd been around when we ran over the ones we didn't find with the lawn mower a few weeks later! The eggs our kids hunt these days are, of course, plastic and filled with sugary and chocolaty treats. I hope someone remembers where we put them after last year's hunt. Many will still get all dressed up for Easter, and many will have to pose for pictures that will stay around on people's phones and Facebook pages for years.

Easter may look a lot different these days, but the Good News we celebrate has not changed. The Lord is risen. The Lord is risen indeed! Our kids, just as we were, may be more interested in the candy and the new clothes and shoes, but the Good News of this day is for them and for all of us. However we celebrate, our life is forever different because the tomb is empty.

As we complete our Lenten journey in the days ahead, we will experience the pain and rejection Jesus endured to secure our redemption. In Scripture, music, and proclamation, we will celebrate the story that anchors our faith. I hope you will be with us for all that will lead us to the glorious celebration we will have on Easter morning. Dressed up or not, boiled eggs or plastic--however you celebrate, know that the glorious Good News of Easter is for you and for you to share. The Lord is risen! The Lord is risen indeed! Thanks be to God!

Holy Week Schedule

Holy Week brings several opportunities to reflect on the passion and death of Jesus. These are painful days, but the stories they tell are stories we need to hear if our Easter celebration is to be complete. Here are some things we'll be doing during Holy Week (April 14-20 this year). We hope you'll be here:

April 14, Palm Sunday Text: Luke 19: 28-40 Sermon: "The Lord Needs It!"

We're trying something different this year. We've invited the other downtown churches (St. Al's, Centenary, First Christian, Church of the Redeemer, and Christ the Savior Orthodox) to join us for a Palm Sunday parade before worship that morning. At 10 am we'll gather at a place to be announced soon with folks from all those other churches. We'll hear the Palm Sunday Gospel and pray together before we all proceed to our own buildings waving palm branches and celebrating the Good News. We hope you'll join us or be at our sanctuary to greet us when we arrive.

April 15, 16, and 17 (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday): Prayer and Reflection

All of our tax professionals will breathe a sigh of relief this week, and we invite them and the rest of us to stop by the church any time early this week. We'll have several different options for prayer and reflection set up in the classrooms on the second floor. Come by at your convenience to pray. The sanctuary will also be open if you choose to pray there.

April 18, Maundy Thursday 6:30 p.m. Text: John 13:1-17, 31b-35 Sermon: "A New Commandment"

The choir is hard at work preparing for this service. On this night when Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, we'll celebrate that sacrament. The choir and Andrew and Melisa DeCoux, our faithful readers, will guide us through many of the events Jesus experienced this night. Invite your friends and family to join us for this special Holy Week worship experience.

April 19, Good Friday, 6:30 p.m. Text: John 18:1-19:42 Sermon: "Finished!"

We will gather for a service of solemn remembrance this night at 6:30 pm. We will reflect on the cross and its role in God's plan for our redemption. This is always a special time of worship. We hope you'll be here.

Easter worship begins early. The almanac says the sun will rise at 6:27am, so that's when we'll gather for worship. Watch for a location announcement, outdoors, weather permitting. We'll sing and hear the Good News from the Gospel of John. Then we'll gather in the Fellowship Hall for breakfast. Sunday School will not meet on Easter.

10:30 am Worship on Easter morning will feature new music by the choir, proclamation of the Easter Gospel from the Gospel of Luke and celebration for all of us. Invite family and friends to join us for this glorious time of worship.

Updates from Presbyterian Women of JJ White



Several women from PW of JJ White recently attended the 31st Annual Gathering of Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery of Mississippi held at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Hattiesburg. Sixty-four women from the churches in the Presbytery attended.

The meeting included worship, installation of officers, and an informative program on human trafficking in Mississippi presented by Sandy Middleton, Executive Director, Center for Violence Prevention. An offering of \$1130 was taken to support the efforts of this organization in protecting and aiding victims of this ever-increasing threat in our area.

The PW of the Presbytery of Mississippi has also raised almost \$6000 toward a goal of \$7500 to support Mission Haven in Decatur, Georgia. Mission Haven is a housing facility supported and maintained by PW in five southern states. The housing units serve as temporary homes for mission co-workers of the PCUSA on returning home to the United States.

PW of JJ White will have their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, April 9, at 11:30 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. The meeting will include mission planning, Bible study, and a light lunch. This month the Bible study is lesson 7 of The Promise of God. All women are welcome to come and be a part of this group.
