## **Some Ways You Can Help Us Help Others**

Our Mission Committee continues to find ways for us to help others in our community.

### **MICA Food Pantry**

We thank you for your continuing support of our monthly food collections for the Food Pantry at MICA. We continue to gather non-perishable food and personal hygiene items on the last Sunday of each month. If you are not currently attending worship, you may drop off MICA items at the Church Office any time.

### **Higgins School Weekend Meals**

We have also begun to provide food for the weekends for kids at Higgins School who experience food insecurity on the weekends. We know that many students depend on school breakfasts and lunches for the bulk of their nutrition. This leaves them unsupported on the weekend. We are providing take-home food to several students each weekend. Our Vacation Bible School has provided for the first several weeks. We invite you to bring items to continue this ministry through the school year. There is a list of advisable food items on the front pew. We also invite you to bring personal hygiene items (soap, deodorant, toothpaste, feminine hygiene items). We distribute all these items through the School Nurse at Higgins where we have several members and friends on the staff. See Melisa DeCoux for more information.

### **Winter Suppers**

We will also be distributing drive-up meals on Tuesdays during November, December, January, and February in partnership with other downtown churches. Our dates will be November 16, December 21, January 18, and February 15. Be thinking about putting together a team to provide these meals this winter. We've been doing about 25 meals a week. Folks in our community depend on them.
