### **An Update From the Session**

The PNC and the Session will determine our needs and goals for the search process and coordinate with the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry to get information about our pastoral position posted on the denominational placement website.

In the meantime, we have secured visiting preachers for the early part of next year. Incoming Elder Suzi Drummond is shouldering this responsibility.

Please keep the members of our Session in your prayers as they guide us through this process. As questions arise please communicate with them.
