Any of you who are at least my age (And yes, I know that rules out significant numbers of you!) will probably remember hearing a song on the radio (And yes, I know that dates me, too!) back in the early '80's by Anne Murray called "A Little Good News." It's amazing how that song still speaks after more than 30 years. The song begins with a woman getting up to get the household fed and out the door to work and school one morning. The kids have the morning news on TV. There is news of violence in Lebanon. There is squawking in Congress. She picks up the paper, and the pattern continues; the news is mostly bad. She says she longs for a day when there is only good news to print. The song says, "Nobody robbed a liquor store on the lower part of town. Nobody OD'd; nobody burned a single building down. Nobody fired a shot in anger; nobody had to die in vain. We sure could use a little good news today."



Bryant Gumbel may not read the news on TV these days as he did in that song, but not much else that song sings about has changed much. It's hard to watch the news or read the paper or major magazine and still be hopeful. The lead story on the news in Jackson almost every night is about a shooting or other death. Unfortunately, those same stories appear in our paper too often.

That's why we're using "Sure Could Use a Little Good News!" as this year's Advent theme. We're not trying to bury our heads in the sand or to ignore real problems God is calling us to address, but we are committed to being a place where Good News is the focus of all our gatherings. This newsletter will offer a schedule of all the opportunities for worship and fellowship and service during this season. Our hope is that in each of those gatherings those who attend will experience hope and hear Good News.

Music Notes

Some of you know that our son, Kyle and his wife Maranda recently took a trip to England to celebrate their first wedding anniversary. They were with us for Thanksgiving, and we spent one evening looking at all the pictures they took. They saw lots of beautiful and historic places. One of the highlights of their trip was a trip out to Cambridge and to King's College. The Lessons and Carols service our choir leads during Advent originated in the Chapel of King's College in 1918. The service is broadcast around the world at Christmas. The original plan for the service includes nine readings from Scripture, covering God's redemptive relationship with us since creation. Each of the readings is paired with carols and songs of the season, some traditional and some more recently composed. Like many other choirs, we have reduced the number of readings to make the service fit into our Sunday morning schedule. This year, the choir will sing four carols and the congregation will sing one during the service. Our faithful readers, Andrew and Melisa DeCoux, will read the Scripture. Bob will preach a brief homily during the service. While we won't follow the King's College Chapel order in its entirety, we will hear assurances from Scripture of God's never-failing love, and the choir will help us experience those promises in song. We'll sing Lessons and Carols on Christmas Eve Morning, December 24, during worship. We hope you'll be here.

The week before, on Sunday, December 17, our children will lead part of the morning worship as they sing all new songs in a program called "An ADVENTurous Christmas." Like the adults, they're working hard to prepare for this special event, so we hope you'll be here for it.

The choir will also be singing at the Magnolia Presbyterian Church for their Community Christmas Communion Service on Sunday afternoon, December 17, at 5:00 pm. Bob will be the preacher for that service. You're welcome to join us. Maybe we can pack the house at Magnolia!

The choir will be singing for the 6:00 pm service here on Christmas Eve. We'll have a solo at the 11:00 pm service.

Music is such a big part of the Advent and Christmas seasons. I hope you'll be with us as we celebrate these important seasons.



We're adding an additional worship opportunity during Advent this year. On Sunday, December 3, at 5:30 pm, we'll gather in the sanctuary for a Service of Light. This time of year is filled with opportunities to experience joy, but for many that joy is difficult to find. The pressure of the season takes its toll. For some who are sad, it's hard to be around people who are trying to be happy. The days are short, and the dark nights are long. So on the first Sunday in Advent, we'll gather just as it gets dark to celebrate the Light of the World who is coming to bring joy to us all. We'll sing together. We'll pray together. We'll hear God's Word read and proclaimed. And we'll experience light that will chase away the darkness that closes in too easily.

Advent Wreath

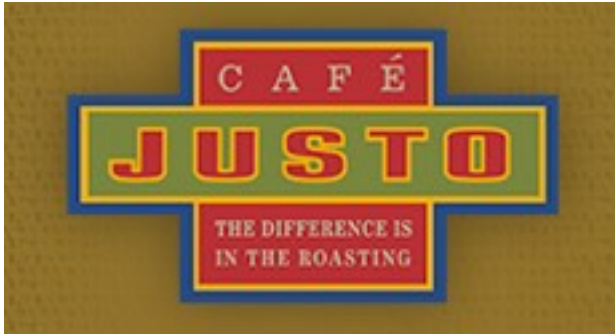
This year as we gather around the Advent Wreath, we'll focus on a special group with ties to our church and give thanks for our partnership. Our Reformed understanding of faith calls us to engage the world in our ministry rather than to retreat from it. We partner with local and global groups to share God's love here at home and beyond. Each week during Advent, we'll hear from one of those groups and give thanks for the work we do together. On December 3, we'll hear about MICA, the McComb Interdenominational Care Association. On December 10, we'll hear about a new partnership we have developed with the Pike County Quilters' Guild. December 17, when our children lead us in worship, we'll hear from Excel By 5, a local early childhood literacy program. Carol Rawlings leads this work, and Deanna Phelps serves as Treasurer. Several others in our church routinely volunteer for Excel. On Christmas Eve Morning, we'll hear from our friend and mission partner, Mark Adams, in Mexico. Mark can't be with us in person, but will send news about the ministry of Frontera de Cristo along the Arizona-Mexico border. Plan to be with us each week during Advent as we celebrate mission partnerships.

Cafe Justo (Just Coffee)

We are taking orders again for Cafe Justo (Just Coffee) You may remember, this is a product of the grower-owned coffee cooperative based in southern Chiapas, Mexico. We found out about it through our 2017 Mission Conference guest Mark Adams. It sells for \$9.00 a bag. We can get it ground or whole bean; dark or medium roast. Please prepay by cash or check (payable to JJWMPC). Only prepaid orders will be made. This will simplify the process. We would like to have an order of at least 25 bags total. We have some orders already, so make yours soon. The coffee is good, and your purchase supports this fair trade effort.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance: “Gift of the Heart” Kits

This project is to provide a way for us to participate in hands-on disaster assistance through assembling these “Gift of the Heart” kits. Below are the lists of items for the two kinds of kits we are putting together for this. There is a third kit - the “clean up bucket” but thanks to the Covenant Life Sunday School and the Presbyterian Women we have that one covered, so we can focus on the two other kits.

If you choose to do a school kit you do not have to provide the cloth bag. Just put the school kit items in a plastic bag and we can put them in the appropriate tote bag for you. (We plan to finalize collection of kits in February so we can prepare for shipping at the time of our annual Mission Conference 2018)

PDA Gift of the Heart Kits

Hygiene Kit

- 1 — hand towel (approximately 16" x 28", no fingertip or bath towels)**
- 1 — washcloth**
- 1 — wide-tooth comb (remove from package)**
- 1 — nail clipper (UPDATE: nail clippers with metal files or emery boards attached are now accepted; remove from package)**
- 1 — bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)**
- 1 — toothbrush (in original packaging)**
- 10 — Band-Aids® or other adhesive bandage strips**

Please do not add toothpaste to the Hygiene Kit. Toothpaste which has an extended expiration date will be added to international Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment. Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure.

School Kit

- 1 — pair of blunt scissors (rounded tip)**
 - 3 — 70-count spiral notebooks or tape-bound pads of 8" x 10 1/2" ruled paper or pads with 200-210 sheets of ruled paper. Do not include filler paper.**
 - 1 — 30-centimeter ruler (12")**
 - 1 — hand-held pencil sharpener**
 - 6 — new pencils with erasers**
 - 1 — large eraser**
 - 1 — box of 24 crayons**
 - 1 — cloth bag, 12" x 14" to 14" x 17" finished size cotton cloth bag with cloth handles; [pattern available](#). (Please, do not use reusable shopping bags or backpacks.)**
- Pack all items in the cloth bag.**

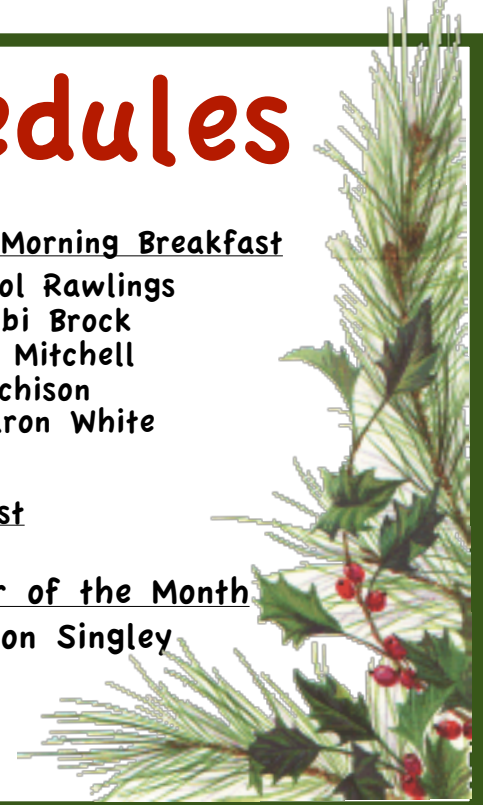
