

Why Lent?

Some of you will remember several years ago now when Mel Gibson shocked a lot of people, including many Christians, when he produced the movie THE PASSION OF THE CHRIST. I will confess up front that I have still not seen it. Many have found it meaningful, including our younger son, with whom I've promised to watch it several times, but haven't yet. I don't have any problems with the graphic scenes of the movie which depict the brutality of the crucifixion of Christ. I suspect it was worse than whatever the movie shows. I haven't seen it for the same reason I have never visited what we often call the Holy Land. I don't need concrete images to strengthen my faith. The way God has shared grace with me through Christ and the Church is enough. That is not to discredit any who find either the movie or the travel helpful. Back when the movie was all the news, I remember hearing people rant and rave on both sides of the issue. Many people who saw the movie seemed never to have thought about what actually happened when Jesus died. I remember talking with a friend from the Episcopal Church about the issue then. She was as baffled at why people were so caught up in the movie and asked, "What's the big deal? Don't these people do Lent?"

Of course many do not. Some worship traditions talk about the cross all the time. I've heard way too many Easter sermons go back through the painful images of Good Friday just in case someone missed church that day. Other worship traditions minimize their emphasis on the cross and its injustice and pain. Neither way is altogether right, of course, but I won't tell them if you won't. Those of us who follow the liturgical year when planning worship focus on the cross and the discipleship it makes

possible for us during these days before Easter. Our emphasis during this season is intended to help us prepare for a joyful celebration on Easter. That doesn't mean, of course, that we don't talk about the cross or about the Resurrection at other times of the year. These days before Easter, however, provide a natural opportunity for us to remember the sacrifice that Jesus made that makes our salvation as a gift possible

We don't require particular sacrifices during Lent, but some find it meaningful to give up something or to take on a new or extra discipline during the season. Some study more; others eat less. Some pray more, others try to hold their tongues. I had a friend who gave up all unnecessary speech during Lent one year. Most of us could benefit from that one.

We will offer several opportunities to focus on Lenten themes this spring. As we watch the earth come back to life after this wet and dreary winter, we can also watch our spirits find new expressions of the life that Jesus calls forth from them. There is a full schedule of activities between now and Holy Week (April 14-20) in this newsletter. I hope that you will find helpful opportunities for both corporate and private devotion during this season.

No one will ask you for an accounting of your time during Lent. But we hope that in worship, in study, and in prayer, you will find opportunities to experience God's presence in your life in meaningful ways.



name (first, middle, last) and current age by Monday, March 4 at 5 pm. We will need a \$50 deposit from each participant by Tuesday, March 5, at noon.



- ◆ approved Lenten schedule and plans
- ◆ approved disbursement of funds from the Foundation.
- ◆ heard reports from Christian Education, Mission and Evangelism, and Worship Committees.

Report from Presbytery



The Presbytery of Mississippi shares a staff position and participates in joint ministries with the Presbytery of South Alabama. The two presbyteries met jointly for the first time on Friday and Saturday, February 8-9, at the Spring Hill Church in Mobile, AL. Whitney Rawlings from our Session and our pastor attended. The Rev. Dr. Rodger Nishioka from Kansas City was the preacher and resource person for the meeting. The two presbyteries met together for worship, presentations, and meals and then retired to separate parts of the church for their business sessions.

Actions taken by our Presbytery include:

- elected the Rev. Phillip Williams from the Vernal Church as Moderator
- elected our pastor, Bob Phelps, as Vice Moderator. Bob will become Moderator in 2020.
- approved the 2019 Budget
- heard reports from the Mission and Christian Nurture Committees and the Commission on the Ministry.
- voted on Constitutional Amendments referred from General Assembly.

Presbytery will meet again on August 10 at the Prospect Church in Meridian.
