***Call to Worship**

This is a night of remembrance for us.

We gather here to lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord.

Throughout long generations, we have received and then handed on to others what the Lord has given us:

The bread of his body, the cup of the new covenant, proclaiming the Lord's death until he comes. Let us worship God!

***Prayer for the Day**

A Reading from the Psalter: Psalm 116:1-2, 12-19

I love the Lord because he has heard the voice of my supplications. Because he inclined his ear to me, therefore I will call on him as long as I live.

What shall I return to the Lord for all his bounty to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord. I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people.

Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his faithful ones. O Lord I am your servant; I am your servant, the child of your serving girl. You have loosed my bonds.

I will offer to you a thanksgiving sacrifice and call on the name of the Lord. I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people, in the courts of the house of the Lord, in your midst, O Jerusalem. Praise the Lord!

A Call to Confession

Even among Jesus' closest friends, not all were clean. Tonight, God invites us to confess the ways we fall short and disappoint, deny, even betray Jesus, our Lord and Teacher. We offer our confession in the sure knowledge that Jesus is both able and willing to wash us in forgiveness and love. Let us confess our sin together:

A Prayer of Confession

Holy God, you call us to serve one another as Christ has served us. We confess that we have not followed Christ's example as often or as fully as we should. We turn away from people in need. True humility eludes us, and we hide our own vulnerability from others. You have commanded us to love others as you have loved us. We confess that we do not love nearly so generously. Gathered on this night, we confess that we are just as capable of denying and betraying you and one another as people in Jesus' day were. Forgive us, merciful God, and cleanse us of all our sin. Then guide our feet to walk with you always. In Christ's holy name we pray. Amen.

Assurance of God's Forgiveness

Friends, disciples of Jesus, having loved his own who were in the world, Jesus loved them to the end. Jesus knows us fully and offers us love and forgiveness unconditionally. In gratitude for the grace given to us and as a witness to our faith in Christ, let us strive to love one another. In Jesus Christ, our sin is forgiven!

A Reading from the Epistles: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." ***Affirmation of Faith**
