

The Importance of Checking In

I know this time of confinement is wearing on all of us. Recent storms didn't help things much for many of us, either. As we begin the process of reopening our state, I encourage you to continue to practice safe practices and to do what you think is best about leaving home. Your Session has met by video conference call during this time and stays in touch by email. For now, we are still not able to give you a date when we can gather for worship again. As soon as we know that the restriction on numbers is lifted, we will announce a plan for reopening.

In the meantime, we continue to broadcast Sunday worship on Facebook Live from Beth and Noggin's back porch. We hope you're tuning in. It stays on the church's Facebook page, so you can watch when it's convenient. We also post a printed copy of the sermon and prayers for each Sunday on the church's website (jjwhitememorial.org). In addition, we continue to distribute daily reflections on Scripture from the Daily Lectionary. We post these to Facebook each Monday through Saturday, and distribute to our email list on those days, too. We hope that this helps us to stay in touch and to unite around God's Word during these strange days.

We also hope that you are checking in with friends and family with whom you are probably not spending as much time as you usually do during this time. An email or a phone call (or maybe an old-fashioned written note if you're getting out to the Post Office) may be just the thing to brighten someone's day.

Of course, pray for one another and for our church family each day. We are thankful for the tireless and dedicated service of Suzi Drummond and Beth Wild who make all this communication possible.

Acts 2 tells the story of Pentecost, which is approaching on the calendar whether we get to celebrate it or not. After all the strange story of flames and tongues and all the other things that happened on that day, Acts 2:42 says, "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." We have decided not to try to do Communion online during these days and to postpone that celebration until we can be together again. The other things the early Christians did are things we can do in these days: devoting ourselves to the teachings of the Church (even if they come from email or video instead of the pulpit), maintaining the fellowship that binds us together even if that's different, too, and prayers for one another and for all believers who struggle with this confinement as we do.

Reach out to someone today to let folks know you're thinking about them. Our community has expanded as our online and video presence has reached people we might not have otherwise. Continue to share these gifts with others and give thanks for the opportunities we have to share Good News in new ways.




These lilies are reminding all of us of the joy of Easter - even through pandemics and tornadoes.
