


Welcome Home

“Welcome home!” are two of the best words most of us ever hear. I haven’t lived in Kentucky since 1994, but it will always be home. A wave of contentment comes over me when I cross the line from Tennessee into Kentucky. When I’m there, I know there will usually be barbeque (mutton, if I’m lucky), familiar places and faces, and lots of memories to cherish. We don’t have a real home there anymore, but we make a home with others. We spent the night with old friends on the way to Indianapolis to get Blake earlier this spring and felt at home. We usually spend a night or two with my sister at Christmas, and we always feel at home.

American poet Robert Frost said that home is that place that when you have to go there, they have to take you in.

I hope that the best parts of all that are what we experienced when we returned to worship this week. We had spent thirteen long weeks apart, so I hope it was a joyful homecoming for those who returned. We might not have gotten to experience all the things that endear this place to us, but I hope it was good to be home.

We have learned new ways to open our home to others. I’m not a Facebook user, but Beth Wild stepped up to the plate in March and helped us learn how to share our worship time with people in places we never dreamed of. Every week, more than a hundred folks find us online and worship with us. Some of those are friends and family of ours and of our folks. Some of them we don’t know, but this technology has enabled us to extend our reach in ways we might not have considered had the circumstances been different. We have invested in some new equipment that will make it even easier to continue to share our worship and our home with others. A few other folks have agreed to join Beth on that team so we can continue even when she’s away.

Our home, which is so dear to us, is now open to people we might never have welcomed if we hadn't taken these steps. Some of our friends who began to worship online with us early shared that experience with friends of theirs, and now our worshipping community includes them, too.


Welcome home, brothers and sisters, however you join us. We're glad to have you among us. Whether you can ever join us in person or not, we are happy to count you among our family!

Some of you may be familiar with an old party game called *Well, I Never!* If you've played it you know both how much fun and how revealing it can be. The idea is simple. Someone states something he's never done, and everyone who has done it has to do something you've all agreed on (leave the group, eat or drink something, confess details—whatever you agree to). As you might imagine you can sometimes learn all kinds of things about people you thought you knew.

The next time I play that game, I'll have to change my list. Before yesterday, I had never been to worship when we didn't sing! I've been in church all my life, and I've never been to a Sunday service when we didn't sing hymns, sometimes sing the Psalms, someone sang something special—music has always been a part of worship. Even at funerals and weddings, we sometimes sing.

Now we're told it's not safe to sing in crowds. We all wondered how that might go. Now that we've gotten that first service behind us, we know that it can happen, whether it feels right or not.

I hope we can sing together again soon, but this change reminds us of our responsibility to one another. When we come together to worship, we are here to praise God and to give thanks for God's presence in our lives. Until now, singing has been a way we could do that together. But we will forego that for a while in order to keep each other safe.

When we can sing again, we will. Until then, we'll have to come up with something else we've never done when we play that game.
